The dropout rate of students is high.</p> <p>7. Opportunities for MOUs for research, placement and collaborations are lacking, less Industry-College interaction is visible.</p> <p>8. There is a restriction on appointment of permanent staff by the government and lack of maintenance grant from the government.</p>

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
