Locational disadvantages in the light of educational, economic and social backwardness of catchment area. 3. College has 10 departments with 10 UG courses. However only 2 PG courses at present. 4. Number of teaching staff with Ph.D. is less. 5. Limited resources for research innovation and extension activity. 6. The dropout rate of students is high. 7. Opportunities for MOUs for research, placement and collaborations are lacking, less Industry-College interaction is visible. 8. There is a restriction on appointment of permanent staff by the government and lack of maintenance grant from the government.

Ensuring the complete attendance in college, is difficult due to the geographical location, weather and other reasons. 3. Mobilization of financial resources is a challenge for the college. 4. Lack of interest among students to go for higher education and career placement due to rural background.



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
